23ART01: Art History and Gallery Tours	Type: Yearly Course
Term 2 Dates: 15/05/2023 and 19/06/2023	Monthly- Mon 14:00 - 15:30

This term we will be looking at an Australian artist, Nora Heysen, and an Italian Master, Caravaggio

Nigel Beresford will present Nora Heysen AM (11 January 1911 – 30 December 2003), She was an Australian artist, the first woman to win the prestigious Archibald Prize in 1938 for portraiture and the first Australian woman appointed as an official war artist.

Following from her Soapbox presentation about Caravaggio, Kate Richardson will further explore Michelangelo Merisi da Caravaggio (1572 – 1610). He was an Italian painter active in Rome for most of his artistic life. During the final four years of his life he moved between Naples, Malta, and Sicily until his death. His paintings have been characterized by art critics as combining a realistic observation of the human state, both physical and emotional, with a dramatic use of lighting, which had a formative influence on Baroque painting,

This course will explore the music of each decade of the late 19th and first part of the 20th centuries and will link to the significant events and people of these decades.

Each session will give an overview of the politics and fashions, famous people, art and literature of the decade. Classical, Pop, Jazz and Musical Comedies of that decade will be explored. It is envisaged that participants will be invited to "sing along" to a well-known song that is relevant to the session (or listen to a "live" rendition)

23LAT01: Introduction to Latin Term 2 Dates:02/05/2023 – 20/06/2023 Venue: RSL Hall Drouin 136A Princes Way, Drouin.

This Course aims to give participants a more modern experience with the classical Latin language, its broad structure, and the place in our community today. Fifty years later, it's not the challenge we may have found at school.

Topics covered by the proposed course will include:

- A range of interactive lecture sessions
- Participant exercises, completed and analysed in-class
- PPT and video clips as available
- History of Latin's development
- Some analysis of grammar
- Developing a vocab of some 250 words
- Some spoken experience, with speech practice sessions.

23IND02: Industrial Revolutions from 1770's to the Future Dates:27/04/2023-22/06/2023 Venue: RSL Hall Drouin 136A Princes Way, Drouin.

"History is not the past but a map of the past, drawn from a particular point of view, to be useful to the modern traveler."

We owe our modern society to the Industrial Revolution which began in the latter half of the 18th Century and continues today. This history unit will follow topics from the 1750's to the future in each session, sparing participants the tedious form of history we studied at school. We will examine topics such as the steam, concrete and coal revolutions in transport and revolutions in our society in terms of poverty, wealth and the making of our current culture. Some aspects will be controversial, such as the unit on energy which will confront global warming issues and the future. Others might be frightening such as the future impact of Artificial Intelligence on our society.

This unit will celebrate what humans have and are achieving, whilst recognising the frailty of our natures and our innate capacity for actions both good and bad.

Most of all this unit will hopefully prove that studying history is not just about events, but the joy of finding out more about us.
